Next time you encounter someone with a tough front, remember Jesus died for them too and there is hidden hurt that only love can mend. Praise God that we have a model to follow...JESUS!

AUGUST DEVO

In Matthew 13:24-30, the plant mentioned is identified as the darnel seed, resembling wheat in its early stages but later revealing itself as a weed that can choke the wheat. Just as wheat bows as it matures, we too, when we grow spiritually and understand God's heart, will bow before Him.

Jesus referred to the church as the Kingdom of Heaven. The genuine believers are represented by the good seed, but among them are false believers, the children of the devil. It can be challenging to distinguish between the two, as true believers may exhibit ungodly behavior and false believers may appear devout. However, it is not our role to separate them, as only God knows the true intentions of the heart.

Jesus himself acknowledged that one of his chosen disciples, Judas, was a devil (Jn 6:70-71). Despite being among the twelve, Judas' true nature was only revealed at the end. The coexistence of non-believers with believers should not be unexpected.

A day will come when the Lord will separate the righteous from the wicked. At the end of time, His angels will make this division. The good seed will shine in the Father's Kingdom, while the bad seed will face judgment.
