The word love is spoken often in our world—but lived out far less. Those serving on the front lines of ministry see this clearly. We don’t encounter a world filled with people seeking from entitlement; we encounter people who are genuinely hurting—children, families, and individuals carrying burdens they never chose. Their need is not abstract. It is visible, persistent, and deeply human.

Yet many times, what is offered is conversation instead of compassion, concern instead of commitment. There is no shortage of talk about ministry, justice, or reaching the lost—but far fewer are willing to step out of comfort to live it. Even within Christian spaces, needs are often acknowledged while action remains absent, and the fruit of love is nowhere to be found. Jesus never modeled a distant or convenient love. He entered broken places. He interrupted routines. He crossed boundaries. He touched those others avoided. His love was costly, personal, and active. To be the hands and feet of Jesus requires more than agreement with truth—it requires obedience to it. It requires sacrifice, humility, and a willingness to move beyond self-focus. Real impact rarely happens in comfort zones;

# WHY NELA YOUTH??

NELA Youth is a mobile, Christ-centered nonprofit dedicated to mentoring and restoring some of the most vulnerable children in our region—youth who have endured **abuse, neglect, severe poverty, violence in the home, parental incarceration, foster care instability, and even human trafficking**. These are children who have been overlooked, unheard, and forced to grow up far too quickly. We meet them right where they are, bringing hope into places marked by brokenness and guiding them toward healing and **identity in Christ**.

Across North Louisiana, countless children are growing up in environments shaped by trauma and instability. Many bounce between homes, witness violence, lack consistent meals, or are left to raise themselves. These kids often feel unwanted and unseen, believing their lives will always be hard because it's all they've ever known.

Without intervention, these children remain caught in generational cycles of hopelessness, survival-mode living, and emotional isolation. They rarely have someone who shows up consistently—someone who believes in them, speaks purpose over them, or helps them navigate life in a healthy direction.

**NELA Youth exists to change that story.**



Our mission is not to offer momentary relief, but to walk with at-risk youth through ongoing mentorship, physical activity, life skills training, spiritual discipleship, positive outings, and meaningful celebrations. We help them break destructive cycles, rebuild confidence, and discover who God created them to be.

One of the ways we steward donor support with excellence is through our mobile mentoring model. Instead of operating from a traditional brick-and-mortar facility with high overhead costs, we bring programs directly into neighborhoods, schools, churches, and community spaces. This allows us to keep expenses low and impact high—ensuring that more resources reach the children who need them most.

Because of this model, **88% of all funding goes directly into youth programs**—supporting mentorship, meals, outreach events, educational resources, transportation, and life-changing experiences for the kids we serve.

We believe every child—no matter their circumstances—deserves a stable mentor, a safe place, and the chance to rise above their past. Through Christ-centered guidance and consistent love, we are raising up young people who will become healthy, confident, Christ-rooted leaders—restorers of their families, their communities, and their future.
